## Cleaning Up After Rodents

(or birds or bats)

Follow these steps when cleaning up after rodents, particularly, if deer mice have been suspected:

- 1. Wear latex or rubber gloves.
- 2. Do <u>not</u> vacuum, sweep or dust. This may spread the hantavirus through the air.
- 3. Mix a solution of 1 cup bleach to 10 cups water and clean with rags, sponges and mops that have been soaked in the solution.
- 4. Thoroughly spray or soak dead rodents, droppings or nesting areas with the bleach solution.
- 5. Wipe down all counter tops, cabinets and drawers, and mop floors and baseboards.
- 6. Steam clean carpets, rugs and upholstered furniture.
- 7. Wash clothes and bedding in hot water and detergent. Set dryer on high.
- 8. Seal contaminated items, including dead rodents, in a plastic bag. Be sure bag is sealed before putting in an outside garbage can.
- 9. Disinfect and throw away your gloves.
- 10. Wash hands thoroughly and shower with soap and hot water.

## If cleaning a building that has been closed up: (such as cabin, shed or garage)

- Air building for 30 minutes by opening windows and doors
- Leave building while it is airing out
- Wear gloves and a dust mask before entering and while cleaning
- Follow steps 1-10 above
- Spray any dirt floors with bleach solution.
